4th Dist. 980 and Hancock - 5th  
Dist. 551 (with more to come from  
part of another county) what  
job Harman of 6th Dist. received  
I don't know.

We are the Third Party we beat the  
Pops. in this city, they will have to go  
on ballot by petition next time there  
are not enough left to take down their  
banner. All candidates endorsed by  
the A. O. A. are badly beaten. Our State  
vote is little behind in this city, with two  
or three exceptions, easily explained our  
city vote is quite won and we are  
now a recognized Party by law as  
far as the city is concerned. Will let  
you know in regard to State when I  
receive information from Secy. of State.  
We have not yet heard exactly how  
your people did.
