

NO PREFERENCE FOR GT. BRITAIN WITHOUT RETURN

QUEBEC, Sept. 3.—In the heart of Quebec, Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen yesterday faced an open-air crowd as is rarely given to a public man in Canada to face. It jammed the Market square of St. Pierre. The estimates ran as high as 20,000.

Mr. Meighen said Conservatives stood for preference with the sister Dominions and with the Motherland, provided there were preferences in return and sufficient protection remained to enable the Canadian workman to sell in his home market.

"We can see no reason," Mr. Meighen pursued, "why we" should give preferences to either sister Dominions or to the Motherland herself unless they are prepared to give us preference in return."
