We are a little in debt having had a hundred thousand leaflets printed for the use of the State Organizer and the various Sections which we furnish to them free for free distribution. The leaflets are WHAT SHALL WE DO TO BE SAVED, WHY AMERICAN

WORKINGMEN SHOULD BE SOCIALISTS, SOCIAL EFFECTS OF MACHINERY and FIRST STEPS TO SOCIALISM with platform annexed. 25,000 of each

I will write to the free library about the "People" as soon as you let me know whether the volume you mentioned is bound, or whether the paper is to be sent weekly. I failed to understand which was intended.

In regard to County organization, Section Stockton can be counted on to look after the whole county, but there are few Sections like Stockton. There is to be a local election there next week and I look for good returns.

Section San Francisco has lately adopted a new Constitution which prohibits members of the State Ex. Com. from holding office in the Section or in the Assembly district clubs. Do you consider such a prohibition advisable and legal? <sup>authority</sup>

Another provision gives the financial secretary to issue receipts for dues instead of the proper due stamp, which receipt is exchangeable for due stamps in the Assembly dist. clubs. There might be no objection to this if the exchange was sure to be made subsequently, but should it fail to be made, both the State and National Committees would be out their proportion of dues received in such cases.

I enclose a copy with the passages marked, but as the document has not been officially submitted to the State com. for approval I do not know as anything can be done at present.
