

Full Statement by Local Seattle

Seattle, Wash., Dec. 25, '08. To the members of the State Committee, S. P. of Washington.

The Revolutionary Socialists of Seattle expect something from the Revolutionary Socialists of Washington, and especially of the members of the State Committee.

Three years ago when the fight between the fanatics and the Protestant Socialists reached the state organization, some Revolutionary Socialists lost time valuable to the party in trying to be neutral.

Two years ago the Mills fight greatly deflated the ranks and weakened the organization of the party in the state, because the state committee for months failed to take action.

The Mills element first made itself felt in the new local when the application of W. D. Mallory, proprietor of Millers barber shop, (later one of the organizers of the Independent Socialists) was presented by E. J. Brown.

Soon after this H. O. Puhber, proprietor of the White House Saloon, who openly proclaimed that he local did right in refusing to try Mills, and that the State Committee committed an outrage in revoking the charter.
