

SOCIALISTS SELECT THEIR CANDIDATES

Convention on Monday Evening Nominated Five Men to Run in Vancouver.

A full Socialist ticket of five candidates is in the field for the forthcoming election. Already—the Socialist campaign has commenced. It is to be energetically prosecuted to the finish, no matter what the chances of success.

Candidates were nominated as follows at a meeting of Socialists held on Monday night: E. T. Kingsley, publisher; R. P. Pettipiece, printer; A. R. Stebbings, plasterer; J. S. Dubberly, electrical worker; J. H. McVety, machinist. The last-mentioned is president of the Vancouver Trades and Labor Council.

Announcement of the party's position with respect to provincial politics was made in the following resolution which was passed unanimously:

"We, the members of Vancouver Local, No. 1, of the Socialist Party of Canada, in nomination meeting assembled,

"Resolve, that we reaffirm our allegiance to the unequivocally revolutionary attitude of the party as set forth in our platform, and that we express our complete confidence in Comrades Hawthorthwaite and Williams as representatives of our class in the local Legislature and thorough appreciation of their efforts in behalf of the workers;

"Further, whereas it is desirable and necessary that all representatives of our party in the House should work unitedly and in harmony;

"Be it resolved that all candidates put up by this local in the coming provincial election shall publicly declare themselves in accord with the policy of our present representatives, and shall pledge themselves to give them their earnest and whole-hearted support, if elected to the House, in this our common struggle toward emancipation."
