

MORTIMER WILL RUN ON SOCIALIST TICKET

Kingsley's Name Is Not on Voters' List in This Province.

CHAS. WILSON NAMED FOR CARIBOO

City Suggestions for Successor to ex-Judge Henderson in County Court.

MR. E. T. KINGSLEY, Socialist nominee for Vancouver city in the provincial campaign, is the candidate who will be unable to run because he is not a voter in the constituency. He is one of the unlucky hundred and fifty-two mentioned yesterday as instigating an attempt to force, by order of the court, the placing of their names on the list. Many of them had votes in other constituencies which they attempted to transfer to Vancouver, but their applications were too late to be in time for the coming election, and will have to stand over to the next court of revision.

Socialists declare that while it now appears likely that Mr. Kingsley will be prevented from running, his place will be taken by another man, and the party ticket filled up. Mr. John T. Mortimore, now addressing Socialist meetings in the interior, is mentioned as the man who will replace Mr. Kingsley. The latter, it appears, never had a vote in this province, and he neglected to apply for one within the proper time.

ASKS PARTICULARS OF HYMAN'S RESIGNATION

Hon. Mr. Borden Puts Question to Prime Minister—House Considers a New Tariff.

Ottawa, Jan. 10.—(Special.)—In the House this afternoon Hon. Mr. Borden, the Conservative leader, again asked for information regarding Mr. Hyman's resignation from the House and the Cabinet. In reply, the Premier said he had not heard from Mr. Hyman himself, but on the authority of a very near relative he heard that his health was very unfavorable and serious, although he did not think his condition was without hope. Under these circumstances he thought the House would consent to some further delay before Mr. Hyman's resignation was called for.

The Commons resumed this afternoon the consideration of the new Customs tariff, the Finance Minister announcing a number of verbal changes in the tariff resolutions. The Government is not yet ready, however, to make public the amendments it is prepared to recommend to Parliament as the result of representations made by the Canadian manufacturers since the new duties were announced in November. A large deputation of western members applied this morning for lower duties on threshing outfits.
