ORGANIZER MOORE ON CUMBERLAND STRIKE

After almost four months of struggle, the men of Cumberland were forced to accept the terms of settlement offered by the representatives of the W. A. C. Co., Frank D. Little and John Matthews. They (Little and Matthews) plainly state for a committee of six members of the Cumberland Union, that there would be no member of the Cumberland Union discriminated against, and no work being stopped in the mine. With this assurance, the strike was declared off August 20th, 10 p. m. Now, nearly two weeks before 12 hours from the time this settlement was made, this honorable agreement is being completely broken.
